On 20th September, we have our Harvest Festival at 6pm, and there will be no service of Holy Communion in the morning on that day. As in past years, you may like to bring gifts of dried and tinned foods which will be taken to Newark Women's Refuge for families suffering domestic abuse. We have supported this charity for many years, and the administrators very much appreciate our gifts.

Rev'd Canon Tony Tucker has announced that he is to retire on 30th September. He has been our Vicar since July 2004 and we offer our thanks for the work he has done with us during the past eleven years. It is not known when a new vicar will be appointed, but in the meantime, our services will continue as usual, led by visiting clergy.

It is very frustrating that we still have not been able to start the church roof repairs. The current hold up is because of ongoing discussions about the type of underfelt which can be used under the terne-coated stainless steel roofing material. Natural England insists that it must be a bat-friendly roughtextured bituminous type, but the contractor is not happy with that as it holds moisture and could cause corrosion. As bats are a protected species, the contractor can be prosecuted if it is thought that a bat roost has been put at risk. Various options are being considered, and we hope that it will soon be possible for the work to start.

The village has been very supportive, and we have raised enough funding for the work to go ahead. That doesn't mean we have all of the money – as it stands, we would be left with no money in reserve at all, and may have to borrow some unless we receive more grant aid – a number of Trusts that we have applied to have not responded yet.

The revised quotation for covering the whole roof in ternecoated steel is £43,051+vat, - assuming that the timbers are
still sound. We hope to be able to claim the vat back. The
cast iron guttering and downpipes will be a further £12,500
plus additional costs already incurred for the architect's fees
and temporary roof coverings.

Thank you very much to everyone who has organised and supported fund raising events. The Willow Tree's BBQ was a fantastic evening and together with sales of 'Raising the Roof' made £1,142.55. We have also enjoyed Karen's coffee morning which made £408, the Summer Concert with John and Sheila's cheese & wine supper raised £670, and Sylvia's knitted toys have made £250 - that's a lot of hedgehogs and penguins!

During the summer, we had two visits from several members of the Grocock family (descendents of Reuben Grocock, landlord of the Willow Tree c.1900), including his great grand-daughter from Australia, and all gave generous donations towards the roof repairs.

Application for an Industrial Scale Wind Farm at Fulbeck A planning application has been submitted by EnergieKontor for a ten x 110m (361ft) turbine wind farm at Fulbeck Airfield which will affect a huge area of our countryside. (There is a photomontage showing a view of the proposed wind turbines from Barnby on the village web site). Following a successful campaign against the Temple Hill Wind Farm, reVOLT and VETO have joined forces to fight this application. The Government is closing one of the finance schemes for wind farms, but another is still running and EnergieKontor clearly hopes to pick up the remaining subsidies as less aggressive developers abandon the market. However, the Government has also introduced new planning guidance which places greater emphasis on consultation with local communities and their concerns. EnergieKontor seems determined to ignore this guidance, but it does mean that local objections - from individuals and councils - will have a key role in this case, so it is important that people make their voice heard. Anyone may comment on a planning application, whether formally notified or not. If you wish to make representations about this application, you should write to South Kesteven District Council at Council Offices, St Peter's Hill, Grantham, NG316PZ; email: planning@southkesteven.gov.uk comment on line at www.southkesteven.gov.uk/planning ref: S15/1764, to be received no later than 2nd October.

DOGS

There must be dogs in the village who are being allowed to run loose. How else would there be dog faeces in the gardens of people who do not have a dog and on the Village Green and the field where children play? Les has to remove dog mess from the Green every time he goes out to mow. The Parish Council has instructed the District Council to set up a Public Protection Order on the Green and playing field which means that animals will not be allowed on there at all. Be vigilant, report any dogs seen out alone or any owners not cleaning up after their dog to the Parish Council. We have a well-kept village, and we do not want dog mess in public places, including on public footpaths.
