THE 'CALLING ALL SAINTS' CYCLE CHALLENGE

Well done to the intrepid trio above – 316k in 3 days, visiting all thirty All Saints' Churches throughout Nottinghamshire. Janine, Paul and Clem braved wind and rain to complete their challenge, cycling up to 80 miles a day, starting from Barnby at 7:30am on Friday, heading off via Coddington, Winthorpe and Collingham, then visiting another 12 churches on the first day, as far as Babworth in the far north of the county. The second day saw them heading south again through the Retford and Mansfield areas to finish in Nottingham, and from there on Sunday, calling at another 8 All Saints' Churches before arriving home in Barnby. A fantastic achievement, which raised over £1,000 through sponsorship and donations from the churches that they visited, where they received warm welcomes, and a lot of support.

On behalf of Barnby PCC, thank you to all three cyclists for the training they put in and the huge effort over the whole weekend; to Janine for her preparation in planning the route, contacting all the churches in advance and organising the fund raising; to the back-up team:- Les picked up and dropped off the riders each day, Derick loaned them his trailer and Steve and Elaine printed the team jerseys.

Our **Service of Remembrance** will be on **Sunday 13th November** at 6pm. This year marks the 100th anniversary of the Battle of the Somme, one of the bloodiest battles in history, fought by the armies of the British and French Empires against the German Empire between July and November 1916 in the most horrific conditions, when more than one million men were killed or wounded.

On Sunday 16 October the Friends of All Saints are holding an **OPEN EVENING WITH WINE AND TAPAS REFRESHMENTS** in the Church from 5pm. We will be celebrating the restoration work achieved so far, and looking at plans for further improvements to ensure that All Saints' Church is preserved and used for many years to come. There will be presentations and information about the building and its history, and informal discussions on how the church could be opened up for wider use by the community. Everyone is welcome, please join us for an informal get-together.

There has been so much support from the village in raising the funds to repair and replace the roof, and now that the structure is sound, the longer term aim is to ensure that the building does not fall into disuse and neglect in the future. As well as planning ongoing restoration work and improvements, the Friends of All Saints' (John Reid, Les Chaplin, Janine Stanley) are exploring ways to keep the Church at the heart of the community for everyone to use and take pride in, whether as a sacred place of worship, or as an important historic monument and a place to meet and hold events.

A questionnaire will be circulated shortly, asking for your views to help the Friends' Group plan how to make the best use of the church as a centre for the community that everyone feels welcome to use.

Anyone interested in learning the traditional skill of church bell ringing is invited to join the Barnby band on most Tuesdays at 7.30 pm. This is not restricted to regular church-goers and is suitable for all age-groups. Practices are held in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere and careful instruction is given by our very experienced ringing master Derek Tysoe.

On the Beat with PCSO Mike Munro

Advice for dog owners

Nottinghamshire Police would like to remind everyone of the importance of making sure they are in full control of their dog at all times - and especially when they are around sheep, livestock and other wild animals. Ultimately a Landowner /Farmer by law, and as a last resort for protecting their livestock, is able to shoot a dog which they believe is worrying sheep. Police MUST be notified by the Landowner/Farmer within 48 hours if this action is taken.

Report concerns about a dangerous dog:

Every dog owner has a legal responsibility to control their dog. It is a criminal offence for the person in charge of a dog to allow it to be dangerously out of control in a public place or on private property. By law, a dog is out of control if it injures a person or behaves in a way that makes someone worried or scared that it might injure them.

When to contact Nottinghamshire Police:

If the dog has bitten a person or animal or is likely to bite.

If the dog is suspected to be one of four banned breeds: Pit Bull Terrier-type, Japanese Tosa, Fila Braziliero or Dogo Argentino.

If a dog has been worrying livestock.

When to contact your District Council:

If a dog is regularly escaping from a property.

A dog is barking persistently.

If you have concerns about children living at the same address as a dog that you believe to be dangerous, contact Nottinghamshire County Council's Children's Services department.

<u>Micro chipping</u> From 6th April 2016 it is compulsory for owners to ensure their dog is micro chipped. Owners of dogs found by the police or local authorities not to have a microchip will have the benefits explained to them and be given a short period to comply with the micro chipping law. If they do not, they could face a fine of up to £500.

Your local Rural Policing Team is looking to conduct a number of patrols around the area whereby we will be speaking with dog owners highlighting the issues of having your dog under control at all times and on a lead, we will also be checking to see that all dogs have been micro chipped in accordance with the new laws. <u>PCSO Mike Munro 07595 074234</u> michael.munro@nottinghamshire.pnn.police.uk
