We don't have the final cost for the defibrillator + installation yet, but Cllr Dobson's grant specified that if there is any surplus from the £500, it should go towards new chairs for the Village Hall. The phone box will need a good clean before it can house the defibrillator, and the Parish Council is planning a **Village Spring Clean Day** for this and a list of other jobs at the Village Hall, the Church and around the village. **Any volunteers to take part?** Please ring or email the Clerk (see below) for more information.

The Parish Council is again appealing for people to park their cars with consideration for others. Most people have a driveway and don't need to leave their car on the road or on the pavement. The far end of Back Lane becomes particularly congested so that on at least two occasions recently, the oil delivery lorry has been unable to access the houses in the cul-de-sac between the Village Hall and The Grange. Imagine how frustrating this is for people who need oil but the lorry has to be turned away.
