Barnby in the Willows Parish Council

At the Annual Parish Council Meeting in May, Cllr Janette Barlow was elected as Chairman of the Parish Council. Our thanks to Cllr Graham Bett for his work as Chairman over many years, and for his continued support for the Council through his experience and his practical skills. The Vice Chairman is Cllr Jackie Parker.

Sadly, Cllr Robert Jones felt that he needed to resign from the Council for health reasons. Rob was born in Barnby, in the little white cottage opposite the Village Hall, and has lived in the village all his life, the youngest of three brothers who all attended the village Jubilee School, taught by one teacher from the ages of 5 to 11. The family lived at Church Cottage, and then Back Lane before moving, with the help of a local farmer's tractor and trailer, to Front Street, where Rob has continued to live all his married life with Jo since 1973. Rob has always been a central figure in the village. His father was Church Warden until he died in 1972, when Rob took on the duties for a time for Revd. Peter Wright. Unfortunately, Rob suffered a major stroke in 2012, but despite the problems this causes him, he still takes an active interest in the village.

There have already been some enquiries about the Parish Council vacancy. It's great to have new people interested, though always very difficult for the Parish Council when they have to choose just one. However, all residents are welcome to attend PC meetings and have the opportunity to speak or ask questions at the start of the meeting. It's especially good to see some of the 'newer' residents getting involved, to continue the sense of community and shared responsibility for our village. The next Parish Council meetings will be on Thursday 20th July, and Thursday 13th September at 7:30pm in the Village Hall, usually with County and District Councillors attending.

There will also be a **SAFER NEIGHBOURHOOD GROUP MEETING** (for Barnby, Coddington and Winthorpe) on Monday 17th July,7:30pm in Barnby Village Hall, chaired by Graham Bett. One of the issues which always crops up at the SNG, is speeding traffic, especially on Barnby's narrow lanes and village streets.

WE KNOW IT'S 30 BUT 20 IS PLENTY

Barnby is a lovely peaceful village. However, speeding vehicles appear to be more frequent. Driving at 30mph will take 40 seconds from the Willow Tree Pub to the Church; if you were to hit someone, there is an 8% chance of causing death.

Driving at 20mph it will take only 20 seconds longer to travel the same distance but reduce the chance of causing death to 1.5%. When you exit the village you are permitted to drive at 60mph but if you hit someone out jogging, cycling, horse riding or driving the other way it could be carnage, so please be considerate to others and yourselves by driving that bit slower so that everyone can enjoy the village and its rural surroundings. Also please be mindful when parking along the roads and lanes for everyone's safety and ease of access.
